Sir.

This has reference to your online proposal No. IA/AS/MIS/57418/2016 dated 9th January, 2018, submitted to this Ministry for grant of Environmental Clearance (EC) in terms of the provisions of the Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) Notification, 2006 under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.

- 2. The proposal for grant of environmental clearance to the project 'Construction of New Integrated Terminal Building at LGBI Airport, Guwahati by M/s Airports Authority of India Guwahati was considered by the Expert Appraisal Committee (Infra-2) in its 27th meeting held on 25th January, 2018. The details of the project, as per the documents submitted by the project proponent, and also as informed during the above meeting, are under:-
- (i) The proposed project is "Construction of New Integrated Terminal Building at LGBI Airport, Guwahati" in Assam State.
- (ii) Construction of new integrated terminal building conforming to GRIHA 4 star rating with all modern facilities in an area of 90,000 sqm excluding service area of 7,500 sqm in basement. Designed passenger capacity of new integrated terminal building is 2900 domestic and 200 international passengers at a time. The building includes Departure area, arrival area, security hold area and concourse area. Multilevel car parking with all amenities is proposed for 500 cars and surface parking for VIP cars & 10 buses.
- (iii) The site is already well connected from the National Highway. State Government will widen existing two lane road to 4 lane road for better connectivity.
- (iv) There is no critically polluted area within 10 Km radius area from the new terminal building site at Guwahati Airport.
- (v) Fresh water requirement: 710 KLD for domestic, food courts, retail, offices, HVAC, etc. (Total water requirement including recycled water 1010 KLD)



- and will be extracted through bore wells at the airport. Necessary permission will be obtained for ground water extraction.
- (vi) Approximately 810 KLD sewage will be generated after the operation of integrated terminal building which will be treated in STP of capacity 1000 KLD. Membrane Bio-Reactor (MBR) Technology will be used for treatment of waste water at the airport. After treatment, treated wastewater will be reused for HVAC, landscaping and green belt purpose. No wastewater will be discharged outside the airport premises.
- (vii) Approximately 3100 kg per day solid waste will be generated during operation of the project, which will be collected, segregated and managed by external agency for disposal. Used lubricating waste oil from maintenance of DG sets and batteries, electronic wastes will be collected separately and will be sold to authorize recyclers as per CPCB/ PCBA guidelines.
- (viii) Landscape and greenery will be developed at and around the new integrated terminal building. More than 60% of existing airport is open and grasses, trees and shrubs.
- (ix) The passenger capacity of proposed new terminal building will be designed for 2900 domestic (including 200 International) at one point of time. The multilevel car parking facility will be provided for at least 1500 cars and 10 buses.
- (x) ToR was granted by the Ministry vide letter No. 10-58/2016-IA-III dated 26th October, 2016 along with Public Hearing.
- (xi) The Project Proponent sought amendment in the ToR on 29th October, 2017 for revised built-up area, water requirement and cost of the project. The EIA/EMP report was prepared after incorporating these amendments and submitted to SPCB for Public hearing. ToR was further amended vide letter dated 22nd March, 2018.
- (xii) Public hearing was conducted for the New Integrated Terminal Building at LGBI Airport Guwahati, on 30th December, 2017 at Circle Office, Azara in District Kamprup, Assam.
- (xiii) Deepor Beel Bird Sanctuary is located at distance of 3.2 km in north-east direction. Application for permission from NBWL has already been submitted.
- (xiv) Cost of the project is Rs. 1232 Crores.
- (xv) Employment Potential: Direct- 360, Indirect, More than 2000.
- (xvi) Benefit of the project: The direct and indirect benefits of the New Integrated Terminal Building at Guwahati Airport are Better infrastructure facilities for passengers, Promotion of tourism, trade, commerce, etc. Increase in regional economy as it will boost tourism and commercial activities in the region. Generation of more revenue to the state, hence more development of the region, More employment opportunity to people and More business and industrial opportunities.
- 3. The project/activity is covered under category A of item 7 (a) i.e. 'Airports' of the schedule to the EIA Notification, 2006 and its amendments, and requires appraisal at Central level by sectoral EAC.



- 4. The EAC deliberated on the information provided by the project proponent and noted that the present Airport was established in 1958. Further in 1989, Air Traffic Control Tower (ATC) was built up along with expansion of existing building which was commissioned in the year 1991-92. Environmental Clearance was not required at that time. The Committee also noted that the Public hearing was conducted on 30th December, 2017 incorporating the revised built-up area and water requirement. The EAC deliberated upon the issues raised during the public hearing/public consultation meeting conducted by the Assam State Pollution Control Board. The issues were raised regarding impact on the surrounding area, Traffic problem due to connectivity with National highway and CSR initiatives. The Committee noted that issues have satisfactorily been responded by the project proponent and incorporated in the final EIA-EMP report.
- 5. The EAC, on being satisfied with the submissions of the project proponent, recommended the project for Construction of 'New Integrated Terminal Building at LGBI Airport', Guwahati by M/s Airports Authority of India Guwahati for grant of environmental clearance and stipulated the following specific conditions along with other environmental conditions while considering for accord of environmental clearance:-

PART A - SPECIFIC CONDITIONS:

- (i) As proposed, Environmental Clearance is for Construction of 'New Integrated Terminal Building' at LGBI Airport, Guwahati by M/s Airports Authority of India Guwahati.
- (ii) Project Proponent shall obtain clearance from Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) and Airports Authority of India (AAI) for safety and project facilities.
- (iii) Consent to Establish/Operate for the project shall be obtained from the State Pollution Control Board as required under the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 and the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974.
- (iv) Clearance from National Board for Wildlife (NBWL) is required before commencement of project/ activity.
- (v) Construction site should be adequately barricaded before the construction begins.
- (vi) Soil and other construction materials should be sprayed with water prior to any loading, unloading or transfer operation so as to maintain the dusty material wet.
- (vii) The soil/construction materials carried by the vehicle should be covered by impervious sheeting to ensure that the dusty materials do not leak from the vehicle.
- (viii) The excavation working area should be sprayed with water after operation so as to maintain the entire surface wet.
- (ix) Soil stockpile shall be managed in such a manner that dust emission and sediment runoff are minimized. Ensure that soil stockpiles are designed with no slope greater than 2:1 (horizontal/vertical). Top soil shall be separately



- stored and used in the development of green belt.
- (x) A detailed drainage plan for rain water shall be drawn up and implemented.
- (xi) Ground water abstraction and rain water recharge shall be as may be prescribed by the CGWA. A clearance of the CGWA shall be obtained in this regards.
- (xii) Noise from vehicles and power machinery and equipment on-site should not exceed the prescribed limit. Equipment should be regularly serviced. Attention should also be given to muffler maintenance and enclosure of noisy equipments.
- (xiii) Where construction activity is likely to cause noise nuisance to nearby residents, restrict operation hours between 7 am to 6 pm.
- (xiv) Solid inert waste found on construction sites consists of building rubble, demolition material, concrete; bricks, timber, plastic, glass, metals, bitumen etc shall be reused/recycled or disposed off as per Solid Waste Management Rule, 2016 and Construction and Demolition Waste Rules, 2016.
- (xv) Diesel power generating sets proposed as source of backup power for elevators and common area illumination during operation phase should be of enclosed type and conform to rules made under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. The height of stack of DG sets should be equal to the height needed for the combined capacity of all proposed DG sets. Use of low sulphur diesel. The location of the DG sets may be decided with in consultation with State Pollution Control Board.
- (xvi) Aircraft maintenance, sensitivity of the location where activities are undertaken, and control of runoff of potential contaminants, chemicals etc shall be properly implemented and reported.
- (xvii) Proper drainage systems, emergency containment in the event of a major spill during monsoon season etc shall be provided.
- (xviii) The runoff from paved structures like Runways, Taxiways, can be routed through drains to oil separation tanks and sedimentation basins before being discharged into rainwater harvesting structures.
- (xix) Storm water drains are to be built for discharging storm water from the air-field to avoid flooding/water logging in project area during monsoon season / cloud bursts.
- (xx) Rain water harvesting for roof run-off and surface run-off, as plan submitted should be implemented. Before recharging the surface run off, pre-treatment must be done to remove suspended matter, oil and grease.
- (xxi) Total fresh water requirement from existing bore wells shall not exceed 710 KLD with permission from CGWB.
- (xxii) Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) of 1000 KLD capacity to treat the wastewater generated from airport. Treated water will be reused for flushing, horticulture, D.G. cooling and HVAC purposes.
- (xxiii) Acoustic enclosures for DG sets, noise barriers for ground-run bays, ear plugs for operating personnel shall be implemented as mitigation measures for noise impact due to ground sources.



- (xxiv) During airport operation period, noise should be controlled to ensure that it does not exceed the prescribed standards. During night time the noise levels measured at the boundary of the building shall be restricted to the permissible levels to comply with the prevalent regulations. A monitoring station for ambient air and noise levels shall be provided in the village nearest to the airport.
- (xxv) The solid wastes shall be segregated as per the norms of the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016. Recycling of wastes such as paper, glass (produced from terminals and aircraft caterers), metal (at aircraft maintenance site), plastics (from aircrafts, terminals and offices), wood, waste oil and solvents (from maintenance and engineering operations), kitchen wastes and vegetable oils (from caterers) shall be carried out.
- (xxvi) Traffic congestion near the entry and exit points from the roads adjoining the Airport shall be avoided. Parking should be fully internalized and no public space should be utilized.
- (xxvii) Traffic Management Study and Mitigation measures as given in the EIA Report shall be implemented in letter and spirit. Apart an assessment of the cumulative impact of all activities being carried out or proposed to be carried out by the project, shall be made for traffic densities and parking capabilities in a 02 kms radius from the site. A detailed traffic management and a traffic decongestion plan drawn up through an organization of repute and specializing in Transport Planning shall be implemented to the satisfaction of the State Urban Development and Transport Departments shall also include the consent of all the concerned implementing agencies.
- (xxviii) Energy conservation measures like installation of LED/CFLs/TFLs for the lighting the areas outside the building should be integral part of the project design and should be in place before project commissioning. Used CFLs and TFLs should be properly collected and disposed off/sent for recycling as per the prevailing guidelines/ rules of the regulatory authority to avoid mercury contamination.
- (xxix) An onsite disaster management plan shall be drawn up to account for risks and accidents. This onsite plan shall be dovetailed with the onsite management plan for the district.
- (xxx) The company shall draw up and implement a corporate social Responsibility plan as per the Company's Act of 2013.
- (xxxi) A water security plan to the satisfaction of the CGWA shall be drawn up to include augmenting water supply and sanitation facilities and recharge of ground water in at least two villages and schools, as part of the C.S.R. activities.

PART B - GENERAL CONDITIONS

(i) A copy of the environmental clearance letter shall also be displayed on the website of the concerned State Pollution Control Board. The EC letter shall also be displayed at the Regional Office, District Industries centre and Collector's Office/ Tehsildar's office for 30 days.

- (ii) The funds earmarked for environmental protection measures shall be kept in separate account and shall not be diverted for other purpose. Year-wise expenditure shall be reported to this Ministry and its concerned Regional Office.
- (iii) Officials from the Regional Office of MoEF&CC, Shillong who would be monitoring the implementation of environmental safeguards should be given full cooperation, facilities and documents/data by the project proponents during their inspection. A complete set of all the documents submitted to MoEF&CC shall be forwarded to the APCCF, Regional Office of MoEF&CC, Shillong.
- (iv) In the case of any change(s) in the scope of the project, the project would require a fresh appraisal by this Ministry.
- (v) The Ministry reserves the right to add additional safeguard measures subsequently, if found necessary, and to take action including revoking of the environment clearance under the provisions of the Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986, to ensure effective implementation of the suggested safeguard measures in a time bound and satisfactory manner.
- (vi) All other statutory clearances such as the approvals for storage of diesel from Chief Controller of Explosives, Fire Department, Civil Aviation Department, the Forest Conservation Act, 1980 and the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 etc. shall be obtained, as applicable by project proponents from the respective competent authorities.
- (vii) These stipulations would be enforced among others under the provisions of the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Public Liability (Insurance) Act, 1991 and the EIA Notification, 2006.
- (viii) The project proponent shall advertise in at least two local Newspapers widely circulated in the region, one of which shall be in the vernacular language informing that the project has been accorded Environmental Clearance and copies of clearance letters are available with the State Pollution Control Board and may also be seen on the website of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change at http://www.envfor.nic.in. The advertisement shall be made within Seven days from the date of receipt of the Clearance letter and a copy of the same shall be forwarded to the Regional Office of this Ministry at Shillong.
- (ix) Any appeal against this clearance shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.
- (x) A copy of the clearance letter shall be sent by the proponent to concerned Panchayat, Zilla Parisad/Municipal Corporation, Urban Local Body and the Local NGO, if any, from whom suggestions/ representations, if any, were received while processing the proposal. The clearance letter shall also be put on the website of the company by the proponent.
- (xi) The proponent shall upload the status of compliance of the stipulated EC conditions, including results of monitored data on their website and shall update the same periodically. It shall simultaneously be sent to the Regional Office of MoEF&CC, the respective Zonal Office of CPCB and the SPCB. The



criteria pollutant levels namely; SPM, RSPM, SO₂, NOx (ambient levels as well as stack emissions) or critical sectoral parameters, indicated for the project shall be monitored and displayed at a convenient location near the main gate of the company in the public domain.

- (xii) The environmental statement for each financial year ending 31st March in Form-V as is mandated to be submitted by the project proponent to the concerned State Pollution Control Board as prescribed under the Environment (Protection) Rules, 1986, as amended subsequently, shall also be put on the website of the company along with the status of compliance of EC conditions and shall also be sent to the respective Regional Offices of MoEF&CC by e-mail.
- 6. This issues with the approval of the Competent Authority.

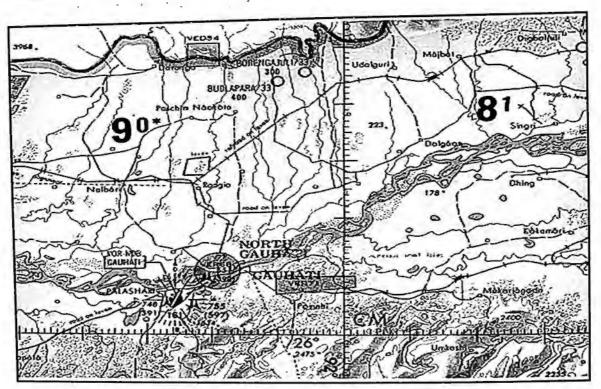

"CONSENT TO ESTABLISH"

"CONSENT TO ESTABLISH" is hereby granted to M/s AIRPORT AUTHORITY OF INDIA NITB GUWAHATI (A UNIT OF AIRPORTS AUTHORITY OF INDIA) for setting up a New Airport terminal for Domestic and International Flights with designed capacity about 700 Domestic & 20 International Flight per day located at SOS Village Road, Borihar, Pin-781005, Dist.: Kamrup (M) (Assam) under Section 25 of Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and Section 21 of Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 as amended under the following terms & conditions:

- No Air, Water, Soil pollution shall be created by the unit beyond the permissible limits prescribed by the Board. The unit would incorporate adequate pollution control measures before they put the plant into operation.
- 2. To maintain the environment and ecology in the area provisions for planting selected species of tree within the compound and approaches along with provisions for park, garden and fountain shall have to be made. Massive aforestation will have to be made by the unit in the factory and township if any.
- 3. As per provisions of Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1974 and Air (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act, 1981 any officer, employed by this Board on its behalf shall without any interruption, shall have the right at any time to enter the unit for inspection, to take samples for analysis and any call for any information etc. violation of this right will lead to the withdrawal of this permission.
- 4. As per provisions of the Act, regular monitoring of Air, Water etc. is to be done by the unit from the location/points fixed by the Board and the report to be submitted to the board monthly.
- Effluent carrying drains must be segregated from storm water drain. Any effluent generated must be treated and disposed after compliance of prescribed standard fixed by the Authority.
- Standard linings on flat embankment of effluent pond shall have to be provided in the pond to prevent and control of overflow seepage and leakage of effluent to the nearby areas and ground water.
- To regularise the subsequent "Consent to Operate" the legal provisions of "Consent to Operate" as per Act and Cess Returns as per Cess Act, 1977 shall have to be timely adhered to.
- Gaseous pollution due to the burning of fuel to run engine boiler, kiln etc. should be controlled by adopting preventive measures adequately.
- Solid waste that arises during the operation should be properly graded and disposed of scientifically without causing environmental degradation.
- 10. For Low lying areas, special care is to be taken by the unit to prevent any overflow, seepage and leakage of effluent.

- 12. All pipe connection, Joints; fittings etc. in the factory and plant are to be frequently checked and shall be leak proof all the time.
- Proper housekeeping and adequate maintenance has to be ensured/ enforced as per provisions of Acts.
- All unwanted Toxic Chemical/Fluid/Gases are to be taken care of as per prescribed norms.
- 15. Production process is to be monitored and in the event of danger immediate shut down is to be ensured by the unit.
- 16. "CONSENT TO ESTABLISH" has been issued basing on the particulars furnished by the applicant and subject to imposition to further/more conditions if warranted by the subsequent development.
- 17. "CONSENT TO ESTABLISH" will be valid till the date of commissioning of the unit or 5 (five) years whichever is earlier.
- 18. Healthy working environment for the worker must be maintained and there should not be health Hazard to the workers for in adequate arrangement for ventilation, dust removal arrangements should be adequate and full proof for the health of the workers. Their health should be regularly monitored.
- 19. The unit must submit compliance report of action taken on the conditions given by the Board before commissioning of the plant.
- 20. Adequate trees should be planted and maintained in the vacant space of the premises and all around the factory and township if any.
- 21. The Board will be at liberty to withdraw the "CONSENT TO ESTABLISH" at any time without notice, if necessary steps for prevention of pollution and prevention of degradation of environment is not taken by the unit as per mentioned conditions.
- 22. This issuance of the "CONSENT TO ESTABLISH" does not convey any property right in their real or personal property or any exclusive privileges nor does it authorize any injury to private property nor any invasion right any infringement of Central, State or Local Laws or Regulations.

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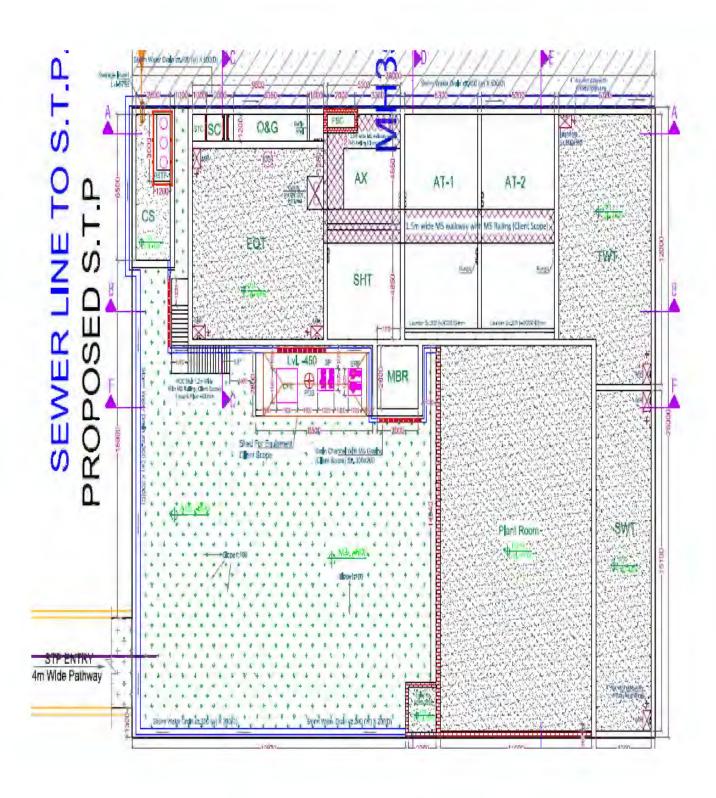

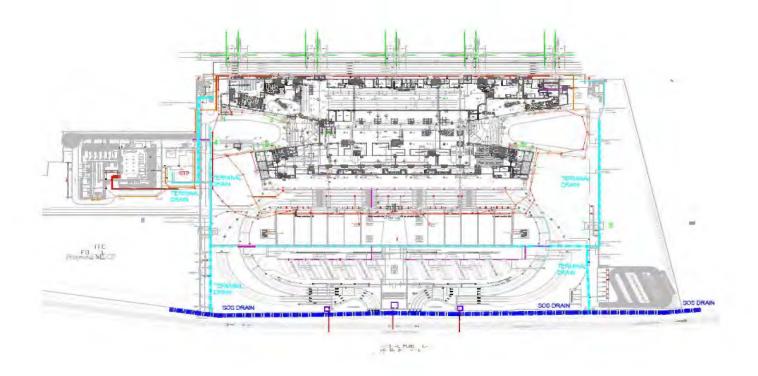

Proposed LGBI Airport Drainage Master Plan



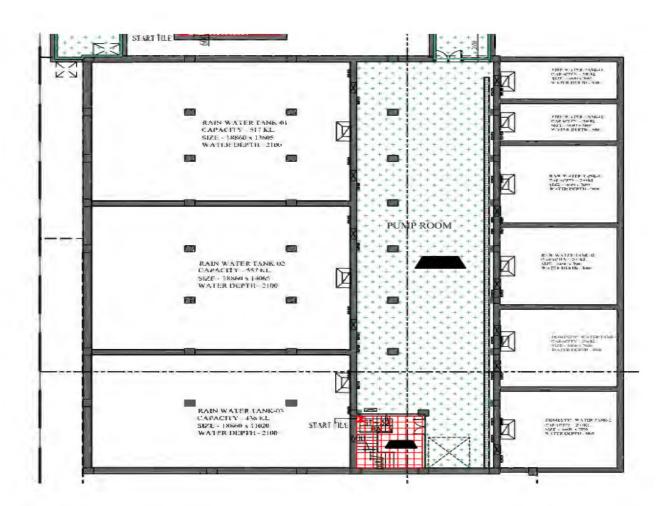
Proposed Layout of Storm Water Drainage & Sewer Network plan at NITB

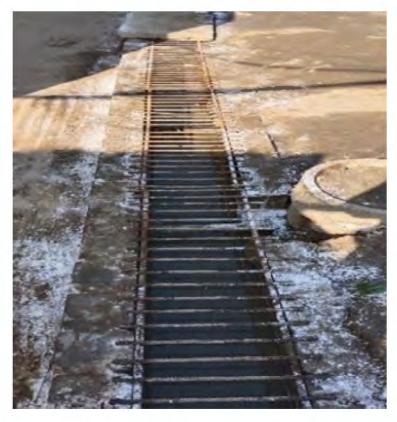

Mandatory conditions:

- 1) Installation of tamper proof digital water flow meter with telemetry on all the abstraction structure(s) shall be mandatory for all users seeking No Objection Certificate and intimation regarding their installation shall be communicated to the CGWA within 30 days of grant of No Objection Certificate.
- 2) Proponents shall mandatorily get water flow meter calibrated from an authorized agency once in a year.
- 3) Construction of purpose-built observation wells (piezometers) for ground water level monitoring shall be mandatory as per Section 14 of Guidelines. Water level data shall be made available to CGWA through web portal. Detailed guidelines for construction of piezometers are given in Annexure-II of the guidelines.
- 4) Proponents shall monitor quality of ground water from the abstraction structure(s) once in a year. Water samples from bore wells/ tube wells / tube wells / tube wells / dug wells shall be collected during April/May every year and analysed in NABL accredited laboratories for basic parameters (cations and anions), heavy metals, pesticides/ organic compounds etc. Water quality data shall be made available to CGWA through the web portal.
- 5) In case of mining projects, additional key wells shall be established in consultation with the Regional Director, CGWB for ground water level monitoring four (4) times a year (January, May, August and November) in core as well as buffer zones of the mine.
- 6) In case of mining project the firm shall submit water quality report of mine discharge/ seepage from Govt. approved/ NABL accredited lab.
- 7) The firm shall report compliance of the NOC conditions online in the website (www.cgwa-noc.gov.in) within one year from the date of issue of this NOC
- 8) Industries abstracting ground water in excess of 100 m 3 /d shall undertake annual water audit through certified auditors and submit audit reports within three months of completion of the same to CGWA. All such industries shall be required to reduce their ground water use by at least 20% over the next three years through appropriate means.
- 9) Application for renewal can be submitted online from 90 days before the expiry of NOC. Ground water withdrawal, if any, after expiry of NOC shall be illegal & liable for legal action as per provisions of Environment (Protection) Act. 1986.
- 10) This NOC is subject to prevailing Central/State Government rules/laws/norms or Court orders related to construction of tube well/ground water abstraction structure / recharge or conservation structure/discharge of effluents or any such matter as applicable.

General conditions:

- 11) No additional ground water abstraction and/or de-watering structures shall be constructed for this purpose without prior approval of the Central Ground Water Authority (CGWA).

- 17) Wherever the NOC is for abstraction of saline water and the existing wells (s) is /are yielding fresh water, the same shall be sealed and new tubewell(s) tapping saline water zone shall be constructed within 3 months of the issuance of NOC. The firm shall also ensure safe disposal of saline residue, if any.
- 18) Unexpected variations in inflow of ground water into the mine pit, if any, shall be reported to the concerned Regional Director, Central Ground Water Board.
- 19) In case of violation of any NOC conditions, the applicant shall be liable to pay the penalties as per Section 16 of Guidelines.
- 20) This NOC does not absolve the proponents of their obligation / requirement to obtain other statutory and administrative clearances from appropriate authorities
- 21) The issue of this NOC does not imply that other statutory / administrative clearances shall be granted to the project by the concerned authorities. Such authorities would consider the project on merits and take decisions independently of the NOC.
- 22) In case of change of ownership, new owner of the industry will have to apply for incorporation of necessary changes in the No Objection Certificate with documentary proof within 60 days of taking over possession of the premises.
- 23) This NOC is being issued without any prejudice to the directions of the Hon'ble NGT/court orders in cases related to ground water or any other related matters.
- 24) Proponents, who have installed/constructed artificial recharge structures in compliance of the NOC granted to them previously and have availed rebate of upto 50% (fifty percent) in the ground water abstraction charges/ground water restoration charges, shall continue to regularly maintain artificial recharge structures.
- 25) Industries which are likely to cause ground water pollution e.g. Tanning, Slaughter Houses, Dye, Chemical/ Petrochemical, Coal washeries, pharmaceutical, other hazardous units etc. (as per CPCB list) need to undertake necessary well head protection measures to ensure prevention of ground water pollution as per Annexure III of the guidelines.
- 26) In case of new infrastructure projects having ground water abstraction of more than 20 m3/day, the firm/entity shall ensure implementation of dual water supply system in the projects.
- 27) In case of infrastructure projects, paved/parking area must be covered with interlocking/perforated tiles or other suitable measures to ensure groundwater infiltration/harvesting.
- 28) In case of coal and other base metal mining projects, the project proponent shall use the advance dewatering technology (by construction of series of dewatering abstraction structures) to avoid contamination of surface water.
- 29) The NOC issued is conditional subject to the conditions mentioned in the Public notice dated 27.01.2021 failing which penalty/EC/cancellation of NOC shall be imposed as the case may be.
- 30) This NOC is issued subject to the clearance of Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC) (if applicable)

(Non-compliance of the conditions mentioned above is likely to result in the cancellation of NOC and legal action against the proponent.)
